Russell's Reserve

Jimmy Russell is a long time Master Distiller for Austen Nichols which produces the Wild Turkey line. He came together with his son, Eddie, to create this special blend, aged ten years, to carry the family name.

Russell's Reserve has smooth caramel and vanilla flavors balanced with mellow, warm notes of white pepper and orange peel.

Rich in toffee and subtle spice notes, this full-bodied bourbon is a beautiful deep amber color with the long-lasting flavor of a truly remarkable bourbon.

Evan Williams Single Barrel

Evan Williams was a Welsh immigrant who is considered one of the pioneers of bourbon. As a farmer his main challenge was getting his crops to a market area to sell. With quick thinking he soon discovered it was very easy to transport his corn and other grains if they were distilled in to a fine bourbon. Thus he is recognized as one of the first distillers in Kentucky. Expect honey and straw in the mouth with a nice smooth burn on the end.

Elijah Craig 18 Year

The Rev. Elijah Craig is sometimes given credit for being the creator of bourbon. This is debatable, but it is known that he was the first to barrel his whiskey in charred oak barrels. The truth is his barn caught on fire, charring the barrels and he opted to use them to see what came of it. The flavor he created rings in every bourbon you taste today. His name sake will give flavors of old oak, cream, almond butter, bacon fat, vanilla extract and smoke.
